Search for Adventure (SFA) connects people with intellectual and developmental disabilities to the world beyond their own communities. The big idea here is that people with disabilities should have the same opportunities to travel and go on vacation as the rest of us. Search for Adventure steps up by offering adventures of a lifetime, regardless of the participants' ability to pay.



Search for Adventure trips are completely customized to be inclusive of all ability levels. Destinations and activities are always guided by the interests of everyone on the trip. During SFA vacations, typical tourist agendas are balanced with true rest and relaxation as well as room for spontaneity. Trip organizers take into account diets, mobility, endurance, personal interests, and finances. The only disappointment for participants is usually that the trip is not long enough!

In 2004, SFA took its first trip to the Appalachian Trail. Since then, we've been to New York City for a film festival by and for people with disabilities and chilled on the beach in Santa Barbara. We've cruised the Bahamas, hung with Mickey at Disney World and swooned over Elvis at Graceland in Tennessee. We've experienced the majesty of the Grand Canyon and ridden the range at the Powderhorn Dude Ranch in Colorado.
